


THE COASTAL PATH OF LA MANCHE IN NORMANDY

WELCOME TO LA MANCHE

450 KM ALONG THE GR[®]223, THROUGH HARBOURS, DUNES AND CLIFFS

La Manche is a destination that's full of character and proud of its uniqueness. No built-up seaside resorts here, just the coastline with its steep cliffs and sandy beaches. From Mont Saint-Michel to the D-Day Beaches through the Cotentin, the 355 kilometres of coasts make it one of France's most maritime departments. The Chausey Islands archipelago and the Channel Islands (Jersey, Guernsey and Aurigny) beckon on the horizon.

The GR[®]223 winds its way through this appealing setting: 23 stages in an unspoilt coastal environment, with patches of Normandy countryside dotted with villages full of often unexpected heritage.

THE EAST COAST

On 6 June 1944 and during the weeks that followed, La Manche went through a decisive phase of the Second World War: the D-Day Landings and the Battle of Normandy.

From Veys Bay to Sainte-Mère-Eglise, numerous sites and museums along the GR[®]223 tell the story of this period: the D-Day Experience in Saint-Cômedu-Mont, the Utah Beach Landing Museum, the Airborne Museum in Sainte-Mère-Eglise, the Azeville and Crisbecq batteries and many more.

The first four stages of the GR®223 will immerse you in the atmosphere of that time. Especially if you plan to visit in June for the parades and festivities in honour of the soldiers who risked their lives for our freedom.







The GR®223 will take you to discover La Hague, the north-eastern headland of the Cotentin where the Sentier des Douaniers trail seems to confront the might of the sea. But before you reach "Little Ireland", you will discover

Val de Saire (Saint-Vaast-La-Hougue, Tatihou Island with its Vauban tower, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the Pointe de Réville, Barfleur, Gatteville Lighthouse, etc.) and Cherbourg-en-Cotentin. Protected by Europe's largest artificial harbour, the biggest city in La Manche is home to two unmissable attractions: La Cité de la Mer and the famous Parapluies de Cherbourg umbrella factory.







THE CÔTE DES HAVRES

Starting from Barneville-Carteret, you can complete the Côte des Havres hike in five days. It's named after eight natural harbours which are virtually unique in France. They are places where a coastal river meets the sea after running through the dune strips. So you will have to bypass them by crossing the mudflats and salt marshes that are typical of the area. On this route, the GR®223 will only come away from the dune strip once, to go by Lessay. This town is famous for its fair, first held in the $11^{\rm th}$ century by the monks at the Abbey.







MONT SAINT-MICHEL BAY

Four stages of the GR®223 run alongside the bay. As you walk from Granville, known as "the Monaco of the North", you'll gain a better and better view of your final destination: Mont Saint-Michel. Although steep at first, the path will level out and skim the coastline so you can discover the landscapes of the bay, which change with the tides and its varying height and breadth. For those looking for a shortcut, that's possible, too: accompanied by a guide, you can enjoy the experience of crossing the bay. Roll up your trousers, discover the unique fauna and flora, and sink your feet into the soft quicksand.

IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF D-DAY

3 STAGES > 2 DAYS / 1 NIGHT

CARENTAN-LES-MARAIS <> SAINTE-MÈRE-ÉGLISE

DAY 1: Carentan-les-Marais > Utah Beach (19 km)

As you leave Carentan, discover the Cotentin and Bessin marshlands before setting off for the D-Day sites, the D-Day Experience in Saint-Côme-du-Mont or the Utah Beach Landing Museum, where this stage ends.

DAY 2: Utah Beach > Sainte-Mère-Église (15 km)

The next part of your trip will take you on a little hike to Sainte-Mère-Église, the first town to be liberated by the Allied troops, and home to the Airborne Museum.



THE WILD COAST OF THE COTENTIN



SAINT-VAAST-LA-HOUGUE <> CHERBOURG-EN-COTENTIN

DAY 1:

St-Vaast-la-Hougue > Gatteville Lighthouse (17 km)

Voted "the French people's favourite village" in 2019, Saint-Vaast-la-Hougue is the starting point for your hike. On this first day, you'll also discover Barfleur, a picturesque little fishing port, then Gatteville. For a great way to round off your day, climb up its 365 steps!

DAV 2

Gatteville Lighthouse > Cap Lévi


Throughout this stage, you'll be walking alongside the sea to reach the Napoleonic fort of Cap Lévi, where comfortable guest rooms await you for a well-deserved rest. More adventurous visitors can also hire bikes there.



DAY 3:

Cap Lévi > Cherbourg-en-Cotentin (19 km)

The path comes away from the coastline for a while to connect with the town of Cherbourg, where you'll be rewarded with a stunning view of the harbour. Once you reach Cherbourg, you can see the old transatlantic terminal and the submarine Le Redoutable at La Cité de la Mer.



WALK TO THE WONDER

> Station-to-station hike



COUTANCES <> MONT SAINT-MICHEL

DAY 1

Tour of Coutances

The first day of your week is spent exploring Coutances. There's one place you really need to visit: its cathedral, a jewel of Normandy Gothic architecture. You can access its upper areas if you book in advance with Coutances Tourisme.

DAY 2

Coutances > Regnéville-sur-Mer (16 km)

This first stage is located on a variant of the GR®223 that connects with the coast at Regnéville-sur-Mer. You'll travel through the Normandy countryside before reaching the estuary formed by the mouth of the Sienne and Soulles rivers.

DAY 3

Regnéville-sur-Mer > St-Martin-de-Bréhal (18 km)

After Regnéville's natural harbour, it's time to visit Vanlée's. Take care during the spring tide period: the road to Saint-Martin-de-Bréhal is submersible!

DAY 4

St-Martin-de-Bréhal > Bouillon

(22 km)

After an initial half-stage, you'll arrive in Granville, which marks your entrance into the Bay of Mont Saint-Michel. Fishing harbour, Christian Dior Museum, walled upper town: there's no shortage of places to visit before you reach your last stop in the south of the town.

DAY 5

Bouillon > Genêts

(19 km)

This stage across undulating terrain offers direct views of the Wonder that is the Mont Saint-Michel. Before Carolles Plage, on the Pignon-Butor platform, you can enjoy a panoramic view stretching from Granville to Cancale. Next, you'll cross the Lude Valley. At the cliff edge, you'll see the Cabane Vauban, located on the site of an old quardhouse. This was a lookout post that was used to relay optical signals between Mont Saint-Michel and Granville.

DAY 6

Bay crossing


Rather than spending 3 days walking around the bay, take a shortcut and let a professional guide accompany you across it. In winter, the bay is deserted and looks sublime in the beautiful eastern light that shines on the Mont. In summer, it will be teeming with fish and small mammals.

DAY 7

Visit to the Mont

After braving the quicksand like the pilgrims in the 13th century, your voyage ends at the Mont with a visit to the abbey. The SNCF station is directly to the south, in Pontorson, for a train to take you back to reality.


